## **Dinner Money Payments**

Please note dinner money is paid in advance of the week via Schoolmoney. Dinner money is  $\pm 12.25$  per week ( $\pm 2.45$  per day).

When you log on to Schoolmoney the figure shown is your current balance either in credit or debit as at that particular day.

#### **Debit Balance**

Please remember to pay the figure that is shown as owing <u>plus</u> the cost of any remaining meals due to be taken by your child for that week.

#### **Credit Balance**

If your balance is in credit, please ensure you have enough credit for any remaining meals due to be taken by your child for that week. If not, a further payment will need to be paid to bring your account up to date.

### **Fish Friday Payments**

Please remember Fish Friday is paid **in advance of the term.** Fish Friday is £4.90 for the remainder of this term (2 weeks). Please follow the same instructions above if you have not already made your payment to bring your account up to date.

#### Free School Meals

Reminder: We appreciate that with the ongoing corona virus your household income may have declined.

If you feel that you would now qualify for Free School Meals as a result of a fall in household income then you may apply to St Helens Council, Education Benefits using the online application form available through St Helens Council website under Free School Meals.

The application process will require you to provide evidence of proof of income and benefits such as Universal Credit which you can upload directly to the website.

#### **Breakfast and After School Clubs**

As both Breakfast and After School Clubs are now back up and running, please can we remind you that bookings should be made in advance, preferably by Friday for the following week. Please send booking requests by email to <u>chapelend@sthelens.org.uk</u>.

Please remember that payment should also be made in advance. Unless you are paying by childcare vouchers, club payments should be made through your child's SchoolMoney account.

When you log on to your child's SchoolMoney account please pay <u>the cost of what your</u> <u>following week's club attendances</u> will amount to secure the place. If, for whatever reason, your child does not then need to attend on a day booked, the payment will go as a credit for the following week.

As a reminder the session costs are as follows: Breakfast Club - £4.00 After School Club - £6.00



## **Junior Milk**

If your child is in receipt of milk cartons in years 3 to 6, there is now an amount of £16.20 showing on your child's SchoolMoney account which covers the provision of milk for the remainder of this year (from 8<sup>th</sup> March through to July). Please can you log on to your child's SchoolMoney account and pay the amount owed before Friday 26<sup>th</sup> March. Thank you.
