From the period of August 2023- April 2024 we will receive **£17,752** as Sports Premium money. This money will be spent in a sustainable and regulated way to ensure we meet our objectives.

Sports Premium will be spent according to the 5 key indicators published by the Department for Education

1. To increase the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity
2. Raise the profile of PE and Sport
3. Increase staff confidence, knowledge and skills in teaching PE and sport
4. Increase the range of sports offered to children
5. Increased participation in competitive sport

Priorities:

1. Ensure that School sport in addition to the National curriculum offer can be accessed
2. Raise the profile of sport through break and lunchtime provision

SHAPES contribution	£1,000	SHAPES is an organisation that provided intra-school sport organisation and CPD for PE subject Leaders in the authority.
Transport to SHAPES competitions	£2,500	Minibus hire for out of school tournaments
Supply cover costs for competitive sports	£3,500	Teachers to cover classes when staff are attending tournaments with children.
Swimming coach certification training	£400	CPD for staff member to be a trained swimming coach along with covering their absence with supply.
Supply cover to cover swimming coaches	£1,500	Teachers to cover classes when staff are attending swimming lessons with children.
Transport to swimming provision	£2160	Coach hire to transport staff and children to the swimming baths
Provision of sports equipment and activities at breaktimes	£500	Purchase of sporting equipment and storage facilities that children can access during breaktimes.
Purchase of resources to diversify the existing curriculum offer.	£800	Resources purchased to broaden the range of activities open to children through National Curriculum delivery.
Storage for new breaktime resources	£ 900	Shed to store equipment.
