Information Documents

May I remind all parents to update school information if home/work phone numbers or emergency contacts have recently changed.

If your child has a new medical condition which requires medication such as asthma, please ensure that you have completed a medical form at the school office.

Thank you to all of our parents/carers who have already completed: child collection forms, acceptable user forms and our home school agreement. If you have not completed these and returned them to your child's class teacher, please do so as soon as possible.

All children will be bringing home a permission to display images form next week. This form will ask you to allow school to publish images of your child on displays, Dojo, the school website, social media platforms, school prospectus and newspaper reports.

COVID

I would like to inform parents that Chapel End Primary School has completed a full risk assessment of school operations with the support of the Local Authority.

As part of this we would like to remind parents that only one parent/carer should visit the school site to drop off and collect their child. We would also like to ask all parents/carers to wear face coverings if they visit the school office.

Please refer to the welcome back letter that was sent out on Friday 3rd September to reference our school systems and procedures. This letter can also be found on the home page of the school website.

Attendance and holiday requests

The Local Authority and DFE are now working very closely with schools to ensure that all children are attending school regularly and consistently. If a child is missing school regularly or is persistently late their academic progress can be seriously jeopardised. For example; a child with a 90% attendance rate at the end of the year will have missed four whole weeks of school and 100 hours of learning opportunities. As a school, we have a threshold agreed with the LA of **96%** attendance as a minimum and our Education Welfare Officer will be proactive in contacting parents/carers of children whose attendance is falling below this threshold.

<u>Earrings</u>

It is school policy that children do not wear earrings in school, this includes earring with plasters covering them. We would like to ask all parents/carers to remove children's earrings before they arrive at school. Teachers are authorised to support children in removing earrings if they wear them in school.





School Photographs

The school photographer will be in school on Thursday 16th September. Children will have individual photos and photos with siblings. More information about how to purchase a photo will follow.

Medical Appointments during school hours

Last year 60 school sessions were missed through pupil's medical appointments being arranged in school time. All medical appointments, including dentist and doctor's appointments, should be arranged, whenever possible, outside of school hours. Please note that in order to satisfy DFE requirements, when appointments are taken in school time, parents must provide medical evidence to support the absence for example by providing an appointment card or hospital appointment letter, clearly marked for the attention of the office staff. Thank you for your cooperation with this.


Roald Dahl Story Day 24th September
