Dinner Money Payments

Debit Balance

Credit Balance

If your balance is in credit, please ensure you have enough credit for any remaining meals due to be taken by your child for that week. If not, a further payment will need to be paid to bring your account up to date.

Please remember Fish Friday is paid <u>in advance of the term.</u> Fish Friday is £12.50 next term (5 weeks). Please follow the same instructions above if you have not already made your payment to bring your account up to date.

Please remember that payment should also be made in advance. Unless you are paying by childcare vouchers, club payments should be made through your child's SchoolMoney account. When you log on to your child's SchoolMoney account please pay the cost of what your following week's club attendances will amount to. If your child does not then need to attend on a day booked, the payment will go as a credit for the following week.

If your child will not be attending a Breakfast Club session please ensure you ring school and speak to a member of the Breakfast Club staff to inform them (01744 678230 option 3).

<u>Likewise</u>, if your child will not be attending After School Club please leave a message with the school office.

School Dojo

As a school, we use Class Dojo as a communication tool with families. This app has been an integral part of our provision during periods of blended learning at home. As we continue to use this system in school, we would like to remind parents about lines of communication for which Dojo is appropriate.

Please use Dojo to:

Post homework-related items to the class teacher.

Message the class teacher informing them of achievements that your child has experienced outside of school.

Responses to teacher requests.

Please do not use Dojo to:

Report absence.

Request administering of medication.

Voice a complaint or grievance.

Teachers are only expected to access Dojo during school working hours 8:30am-4:30pm

School Uniform

Boys Uniform

Red round-neck school jumper <u>displaying the Chapel End Primary School emblem.</u>
White polo T-shirt
Grey trousers/short-trousers in summer
Plain grey socks
Black school shoes



Girls Uniform

Red round-neck school jumper or red school cardigan <u>displaying the Chapel End Primary School emblem.</u>
White polo T-shirt

Plain grey pinafore, grey skirt (appropriate length) or grey trousers

Red gingham dress in summer (red and white checks)

Grey tights

White socks (recommended for Summer) Grey socks (recommended for Winter)

Black Shoes

Girls in KS2 can also wear playsuits as an alternative to summer dresses, provided they are summer dress material (red/white gingham).

Footwear

We want our children's feet to be healthy and flourish, therefore all pupils must wear sensible, well-fitting shoes with an appropriate low heel. Boots are not allowed in the classroom, therefore on bad weather days if your child wears boots to school they must remember to bring their school shoes to change into. Trainers are not allowed to be worn in school with the exception of times when children are participating in planned physical activities.

Nursery

Children of Nursery age are permitted to wear black or grey jogging trousers to support gross motor skill activities and toilet training.
